Ronald McDonald House Charities® of Greater Washington, DC (RMHCDC) eases the hardship of childhood illness on families through programs that directly improve the health and wellbeing of children.

THREE CORE PROGRAMS



Ronald McDonald House®: *Keeping Families Close*

Many families travel far from home and often spend weeks or months away to get the best treatment for their seriously ill or injured children. Our Ronald McDonald Houses provide a home for families so they can stay close by their hospitalized child at little or no cost. Our Houses are built on the simple idea that nothing else should matter when a family is focused on the health of their child - not where they can afford to stay or where they will get their next meal. Staying at our Houses improves adherence to needed treatment plans and allows better communication with the child's medical team.



Ronald McDonald Care Mobile®: *Keeping Children Healthy*

Our KIDS Mobile Medical Clinic/Ronald McDonald Care Mobile (KMMC/RMCM) delivers free health care to children, ages birth to 21, in underserved communities in DC. These children are often at risk and have poor access to comprehensive pediatric medical services. The KMMC/RMCM, operates in association with MedStar Georgetown, provides high quality, cost-effective, family-centered medical care to these children regardless of financial means. The FITNESS (Fun in Teaching Nutrition and Exercise to Successful Students) Program is a new initiative of RMHCDC and MedStar Georgetown. Partnering with local schools in DC, MD and VA, this second mobile unit will deliver a curriculum focusing on healthy eating and the importance of physical activity to students in grades K-8.



Ronald McDonald Family Room®: *Supporting Family-Centered Care*

Our Ronald McDonald Family Rooms (RMFR) in the Hematology/Oncology unit at Children's National and at Inova Children's Hospital complement our partner hospitals' family-centered approach to patient care. The Family Rooms provide families a place to regroup just steps from their child and make it easier for parents to actively participate in their child's treatment plan.

JORDYN'S STORY

Jordyn is one of the brightest lights we've ever seen and she can't be contained! **This explains why she joined the world 16 weeks early weighing 1 lb. 9 oz.** (After 62 hours of doctors trying unsuccessfully to stop labor!)

Doctors discovered her small intestine was dead and she had no large intestine. By the time Jordyn was 4 years old, she had 14 surgeries and the next step was organ transplant.

At 4 years old, Jordyn had 4 organ transplants: small intestine, large intestine, pancreas, and liver. She recuperated in the hospital for 51 days and spent a month relearning to breath, stand, and walk on her own.

The next month, when her mother, Lynette, came to stay at our Ronald McDonald House, she only expected to stay for 3 months. **No one could have known the uphill battle Jordyn would have to get well.** It was 17 months before Lynette and Jordyn could go home.

Lynette says she would have been "a wreck" without Ronald McDonald House. While staying at RMH, there was no stress about food or where she would sleep, and the comfort and support she received from staff and fellow families was irreplaceable. Lynette said being at the House also helped her take care of herself, which allowed her to focus on being there for Jordyn.

In her 6 short years Jordyn has had close to 30 procedures. She has been in and out of hospitals fighting infections and complications, but her contagious smile and positivity make everyone around her more confident, especially her mom. Lynette enrolled Jordyn in Kindergarten in August and she loves it!

Lynette says, "I appreciate everything that was done for us," from the volunteers that came in to cook to the lifelong friends they found along the way. **Thank you for being a part of their story and success.**

PROGRAM GROWTH IN 2016

Your investment at work

1. Across our three core programs, **3,224 children were served in 2016.**

2. The **FITNESS (Fun in Teaching Nutrition and Exercise to Successful Students) Program** is a new initiative of RMHCDC and MedStar Georgetown. Partnering with local schools in DC, MD and VA, this second mobile unit will deliver a curriculum focusing on healthy eating and the importance of physical activity to students in grades K-8.



3. The **Ronald McDonald Family Room (RMFR) at Inova Children's Hospital** has expanded **service** to include the Pediatric Intensive Care Unit, Neonatal Intensive Care Unit, Cardiac Care, and Medical-Surgical units. This new RMFR also meets families and kids where they are by taking a Happy Wheels cart filled with snacks, toys, books, blankets, and toiletries to the different floors and to the bedside of the most sick kids.

4. Our **Ronald McDonald Houses** have increased occupancy to **83%** including a family from the Phillipines that have stayed with us for two years in the DC House and a family that stayed with us for 17 months at the Northern Virginia House.
