Ronald McDonald House Charities® of Greater Washington, DC (RMHCDC) eases the hardship of childhood illness on families through programs that directly improve the health and wellbeing of children.

THREE CORE PROGRAMS



Ronald McDonald House®: *Keeping Families Close*

Many families travel far from home and often spend weeks or months away to get the best treatment for their seriously ill or injured children. Our two Ronald McDonald Houses provide a home for families so they can stay close by their hospitalized child at little or no cost. Our Ronald McDonald Houses are built on the simple idea that nothing else should matter when a family is focused on the health of their child - not where they can afford to stay or where they will get their next meal. Staying at our Ronald McDonald Houses improves adherence to needed treatment plans and allows better communication with the child's medical team.



Ronald McDonald Care Mobile®: *Giving Children Access to Health Care*

We operate two Ronald McDonald Care Mobiles in association with MedStar Georgetown University Hospital: the KIDS Mobile Medical Clinic/ Ronald McDonald Care Mobile (KMMC/RMCM) and the Ronald McDonald Care Mobile, home of the FITNESS (Fun in Teaching Nutrition and Exercise to Successful Students) Program. The KMMC/RMCM delivers free, high quality, family-centered medical care to children from birth to 21 within their communities. Children who often have poor access to comprehensive pediatric medical services, receive this care regardless of financial means. The FITNESS Program is an initiative that partners with local schools in DC. This second Ronald McDonald Care Mobile delivers a curriculum focusing on healthy eating and the importance of physical activity to students in grades K-8.



Ronald McDonald Family Room®: *Supporting Family-Centered Care*

Our Ronald McDonald Family Rooms (RMFR) on the Hematology/Oncology unit at Children's National Health System, and in Inova Children's Hospital on the 8th floor Pediatric Intensive Care unit and 10th floor Hematology/Oncology unit, complement our partner hospitals' family-centered approach to patient care. The Family Rooms provide families a place to regroup just steps from their child and make it easier for parents to actively participate in their child's treatment plan.

EASTON'S STORY

You kept a mom, dad, and three brothers close when they needed it most.

When Easton was born at 27 weeks, no one knew if he would survive. He weighed just 1 pound, 7 ounces, and couldn't breathe on his own.

His mom, Kayla, doesn't mince words when she describes what his first few months were like for her family. "We were at the most vulnerable place you can imagine," she says. "We were fearing for the life of our child, hanging on to the words of doctors and nurses, desperately praying, and grasping at any glimpse of hope. I would never wish it on anyone."

But you made dark days brighter... for Kayla, and her whole family. Because you gave, they could stay right by the hospital at Ronald McDonald House, rallying around Easton while he fought for his life. That meant they didn't have to make the long trip back and forth to their home. But that's not all.

Kayla says, "One of the best things about staying at Ronald McDonald House is that Easton's big brothers were able to stay with us, too." **Jase, age 8, and Ty, 6, were scared for their baby brother's life and didn't want to be away from him - or their mom and dad - for even a day.**

So, for the next 84 days, the family of five could stay close. They formed close bonds with the families around them, too. "The other families knew exactly what we were going through," Kayla says. Easton is a happy, healthy toddler now - and Kayla and the parents she met at Ronald McDonald House still keep in touch!

Today, Kayla has a special message for you: "Because of your generosity, Ronald McDonald House has been and will continue to be an answered prayer to so many."

PROGRAM GROWTH in 2017

Your investment at work.

1. **Across our three core programs, 7,785 children were served in 2017.**
2. **The Ronald McDonald Care Mobile (RMCM), home of the FITNESS (Fun in Teaching Nutrition and Exercise to Successful Students) Program hit the road and made new community partnerships with local schools in DC.** RMHCDC is proud to work in collaboration with Medstar Georgetown University Hospital's Division of Community Pediatrics to administer the FITNESS program. This second RMCM delivers a curriculum focusing on healthy eating and the importance of physical activity to students in grades K-8 and served 1,832 children in 2017.
3. The **Ronald McDonald Family Room (RMFR) at Inova Children's Hospital expanded service to two Family Rooms in February 2018.** This new RMFR meets families and kids where they are by extending our reach to multiple floors.
4. **Keeping our families safe during their stay is of the utmost importance to RMHCDC.** In 2017, we enhanced our ability to do so by installing comprehensive access control, closed circuit television and security monitoring systems at both Ronald McDonald Houses. The new systems add an extra layer of security that gives us and our families additional peace of mind after they enter our facilities.
5. **In 2017, auto-opening handicapped access doors were installed at the front entrances of both the VA and DC Ronald McDonald Houses.** We are so grateful to the Melody Shafie Foundation for Neuroblastoma for their kind donation that made this possible. Now, families with children in wheelchairs and strollers have a much easier time entering and exiting the Houses. Feedback from families about this important upgrade has been very positive!
6. A new playhouse, resembling a large sandcastle, has been installed at the Ronald McDonald House of Washington, DC for the use of our youngest visitors. **The playhouse is wheelchair accessible and equipped with a variety of sensory activities.** This unique playhouse was generously donated by Fred and Wendy Goldberg, with the support of Rebuilding Together Montgomery County, TW Perry, M Luis Construction, Accessible Home Association, Levine Design Studio, Pro-Home Contractor, Finding a New Normal, and D.G. Liu Contractor. RMHCDC is very excited to expand our playground options, especially for children with more limited mobility - thank you to our donors!
7. In an effort to accommodate larger families who have an extended stay at the Ronald McDonald House of Washington DC, we have repurposed a former staff apartment to provide additional space for those who need it. **The long term apartment allows bigger families a more comfortable stay as they focus on caring for their child undergoing treatment.**
